Spotlight on the Artist

Carol Scott



This month's featured artist is Carol Scott. Carol Scott is a local photographer. She grew up in North Central Texas

What brought you to Kodiak?

My husband and I visited Alaska for the first time on our honeymoon - a backpacking trip in Wrangell-St. Elias National Park. (It had always been a dream of mine to spend my honeymoon backpacking in Alaska.) We fell completely in love with Alaska while on that trip. When we returned home (West Texas, at the time), we knew we belonged back in Alaska and began the process of searching for a position for my husband that would take us back. We felt God opened up a position for him at KEA. We interviewed in Kodiak in January of 2000. The moment we stepped off the plane, we knew this was home.

What is your training background?

I learned the basics of photography through a photo-journalism course taken many years ago. Since then, I have expanded my knowledge and developed my methods through workshops, books and magazines, membership in professional organizations, online photography forums, and a LOT of time both behind the camera and in front of the computer.

What are your influences?

Although I am drawn to the visual arts, I have always been influenced by the words spoken through imagery. I believe images can be a powerful way of telling a story, whether it be a touching portrait of a child just beginning his or her journey in life or an edgier image of a seasoned fishing vessel with decades of history lying just beneath her layers of peeling paint. As the saying goes, "A picture is worth 1,000 words." My goal is that each image I create tells a story, either through the power of its own history or by speaking to a shared memory between the image and its viewer.

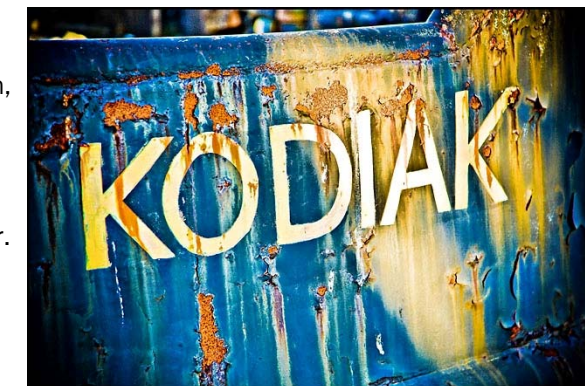
I am inspired by the color, texture and character found in and around Kodiak's harbors as well as in the beauty and raw energy of the island's wildlife and scenery.

What are your plans for the future?

I hope to continue uncovering stories through my camera's lens. I would love to have my work displayed at the Anchorage Museum one day.

Marine Inspired Art

There are some exciting new outreach activities at the Ocean Science Discovery Lab coming this spring! Marine Inspired Art at the Ocean Science Discovery Lab is the result of collaboration between the National Marine Fisheries Service Kodiak Laboratory, the Kodiak Arts Council, and the KIBSD. These community events combine a short lecture about the theme animals at the touch tank followed by an art activity led by local artist Elizabeth O'Donnell.

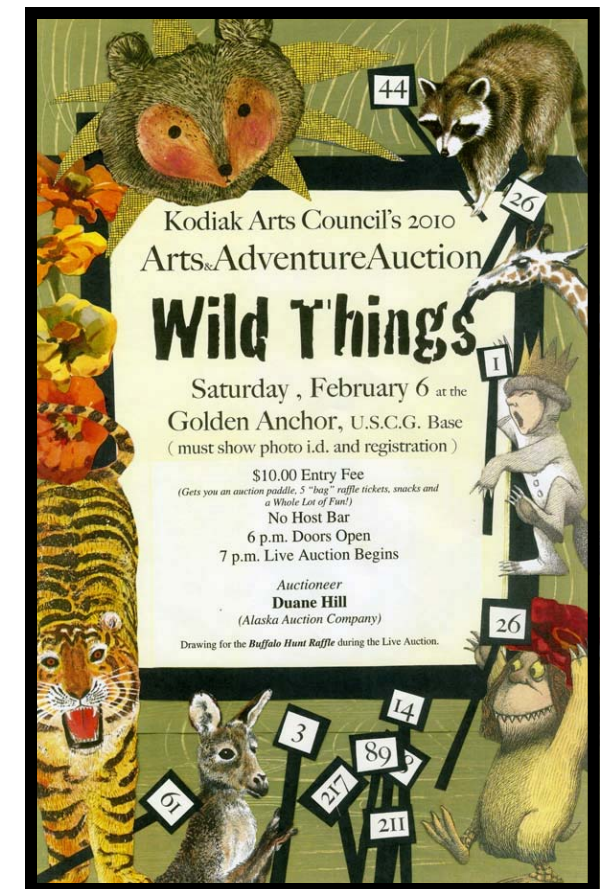


The first event is on Saturday, February 13, from 2-4pm on sea stars and sea urchins. The second event is planned for March 13, from 2-4pm on Alaskan crab. The third event is planned for April 17, from 2-4pm on jellyfish. All events are open to all ages and are free of charge. Children under 8 years should be accompanied and supervised by an adult.

All events are offered at the Kodiak Fisheries Research Center building, which is the building with the touch tank. After crossing the bridge, turn left and then take the SECOND driveway on the left (NOT the first).
